



Inclusive education in New Brunswick

The CDPA is made up of five research teams –
Federal disability policy, Employment issues, Inclusive education, Health services, and Culture & recreation.

CDPA's Education team has focused its research on discovering variances in inclusive education policy across the country, and on the potential for disconnect between policy and practice. The team conducted a comprehensive policy scan, as well as consultations with government and labour leaders. In July 2012, the government of New Brunswick released a report by Dr. Gordon Porter (Community co-lead of the Education team), entitled *Strengthening Inclusion, Strengthening Schools*. In response to recommendations in that report, New Brunswick Minister of Education and Early Childhood Development, Hon.
