

Witnessing democracy

In October, CDPA was invited to act as a witness before the Standing Committee on Human Resources, Skills and Social Development and the Status of Persons with Disabilities (commonly known as HUMA), in its deliberations toward 3rd reading of Bill C-81: An act to ensure a barrier-free Canada. We took this opportunity to reinforce the need for all law and policy in Canada to be subjected to a disability lens – an objective that Minister Qualtrough has repeatedly endorsed. The CDPA's own <u>Disability Policy Lens</u> was presented as a means of ensuring that the implications for people with disabilities are taken into account in every policy in Canada. As a bonus of presenting the Lens to a federal government committee, it was translated into French, and we are now proud to be able to offer the CDPA Disability Policy Lens in French.
